# Basic Message or Main Statement by SHIMIZU Kōichi

Even in the world economic crisis and dramatic shrink of the car sales, which have brought a big trouble to all car makers, Toyota seems to consolidate its status as the world No.1 car maker. Such a high competitive edge is regarded as coming from its famous Toyota Production System (TPS). In contrast with a received opinion, however, the TPS cannot be reduced to well known technologies such as "Just-in-Time", "Jido-ka", etc. In fact, the TPS has another component, created also by Taiichi Ohno, which is the production efficiency management, connected with the wage system, and then with the human resource management. And it is this management that Toyota radically altered during the 1990s. At the dawn of the 21<sup>st</sup> century, Toyota introduced a brand new wage system and modified its production efficiency management, which had promised Toyota the high competitive edge during almost fifty years. So, we want to explain this change and to discuss why and what purpose Toyota has made such a change.
