Summary

The successful Japanese catch-up business model, which brought Japan to the world leading position in the 1980s, is dead. We need to build up a new business model to meet the drastic change of the world business environment. Open innovation with ICT, flat-world, and the growing BRICs are forcing Japan to such a change.

World leading technology and efficient plant operations are no longer the key factor in manufacturing industry. Technology-oriented Japanese mobile phone has lost its leadership, LCD TV is being challenged, while Solar Battery is no longer without competitors. World competitors with less technology are developing new efficient business model with entrepreneurship and global integration.

Professor Maeda will argue some prescription to help the necessary transformation of the Japanese business model.

Dr. Noboru Maeda, Professor at Aoyama Business School, received his Master Degree from Keio University, and Ph.D from Kochi University of Technology. He has 10 years academic field career in Osaka City University and others. Before that he had worked as an executive manager for IBM and SONY in Japan, USA and Europe during 30 years with positions in product and business plan or development. He had also been Research Associate at NISTEP of MEXT for 10 years.

He published several books on Industry Clusters, Entrepreneurship and Globalization.
