Summary

This talk is based on some of my recent papers, which statistically estimate political impacts on intergovernmental fiscal transfers in Japan. The first paper (AJPS 2003) shows that the electoral reform of 1994 resulted in an unprecedented degree of equalization in legislative representation (*teisū zesei*), which resulted in an equalization of total transfers per person. The second paper (under review) shows that contrary to a widely shared belief, under the old electoral system for Lower House elections (i.e., the SNTV system) the governing coalition manipulated the budget allocation in favor of the opposition – empirical evidence for the distributive consequences of politics of collusion (*kokutai seiji*) in Japan. The third working paper estimates the impacts of political participation on per capita total transfers.

Biography

Y. HORIUCHI is a Senior Lecturer in the Crawford School of Economics and Government at the Australian National University. He earned his M.A. in economics from Yale University and Ph.D. in political science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. His research interests include comparative politics, political economy, public opinion, and research methods. He is the author *Institutions, Incentives and Electoral Participation in Japan: Cross-Level and Cross-National Perspectives* (RoutledgeCurzon 2005). He also published articles in *American Journal of Political Science*, *British Journal of Political Science*, *Comparative Political Studies*, *Journal of Conflict Resolution*, among others.
