Summary

Japanese national universities were incorporated in 2004 and became much more autonomous from the government in their operation. After nearly six years since the incorporation, which correspond to the period of the first mid-term plans (a kind of contracts

between the government and national universities), remarkable changes as well as problems can be observed in new national university corporations. This seminar will focus on pros and cons of the reform.

His current research interests include diverse university governance issues, particularly in comparative perspective.
