Summary

Japanese society is not strictly meritocratic. In East Asia, meritocracy prevails in China, Korea and Vietnam, not in Japan. Needless to say, it is about the pre-modern period. In a similar vein, in Western Europe meritocracy did not prevail either in the pre-modern period. How Japanese choose their future life has developed in the modern period with meritocracy, hereditary principle and fairness combined.
